



“Can God prepare a table in the wilderness?” “He sent food to the full.”

Psalms:78

When the Children of Israel were in the wilderness they ran out of food. Moses prayed and God sent manna.

“...that he might make thee know that man doth not live by bread only, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of the Lord doth man live.” Deuteronomy :5



Let's look at some of the ways to do this.

In Genesis 1 there is a spiritual account of creation. God (who in this chapter is called Elohim) creates man in His image and likeness. He gives man all the plants and seeds for food and sees that everything is GOOD!

In Genesis 2 there is a different story of creation. This is the story of a tribal god named Jehovah who creates man out of mud. A snake gets Eve to eat fruit off the



tree of the knowledge of good and evil. She gives the fruit to Adam and he also eats. It does not turn out well for them.

At the beginning of Jesus' ministry, he was baptized and then went into the wilderness for 40 days to think and pray. The Devil comes to tempt him to use his power for material things. One thing he tells him he can do is turn stones into bread.



Jesus doesn't argue with the devil. He quotes the Bible as his answer.

"Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." Matthew:4

After 2 more tries, the devil leaves him alone and angels come to care for him.

In Corinthians, Paul writes, *“I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the simplicity that is in Christ.”*

“As in Adam all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive.”

In his Sermon on the Mount gave us the Beatitudes. Here are 3.

“Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.”

Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.”

“Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.”

In Psalms it says, *The meek shall eat and be satisfied: they shall praise the Lord that seek him: your heart shall live for ever.”*

After the Beatitudes Jesus gives some important directions.


“Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat,



or what ye shall drink,




nor yet for your body, what ye shall put on.



Is not the life more than meat and the body than raiment?”

“But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you.”

We have looked from the first book in the Bible, Genesis, to the last book, Revelations.
